Council Meeting Highlights-March 16th, 2017

- Bylaw #529 Reduction of Council was passed.—all future councils will now consist of five elected officials, one mayor elected at large and four councillors.
- The Town of Sedgewick renewed a three-year contract with Flagstaff County for Peace Officer Services. Flagstaff County will provide services to the Towns and Villages free of charge.
- A motion was made that the Town of Sedgewick withdraw from the Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership's (FIP) Regional Governance subcommittee process at this time; however, will remain full active members of FIP.
- Flagstaff County advised they will continue to provide recreation funding to Agricultural societies - please be advised Phase I recreation grants are now available online or at the Town Office. Deadline for submission is May 1st, 2017
- Next council meeting is April 20th, 2017 at 6:00 p.m.
