February 2017—Council Meeting Highlights

- ◇ The approved audited financial statement for the year ending December 31st, 2016 is available for pick up at the Town Office.
- ◇ The Sedgewick Community Hall's 2017 revised budget was approved.
- ◇ A contract was approved with Brian King Professional Corporation for financial audit services: 2017– 2019.
- ◇ Please be advised, Council gave 1st to Bylaw #529 "Reduction of Councillors". Council is preparing to give 2nd and 3rd reading during the March 16th, 2017 meeting at 6:00 p.m. in the chambers at the Town Office, everyone welcome.

A reduction in council means changing from an elected body of seven (7) to an elected body of five (5). The Chief Elected Officer (Mayor) will continue to be elected at large.

Bylaw #529 is open for public comment. Contact the Mayor or Councillor's if you have any question or concerns.

Dog licences were due by January 31st. If you have not paid you licence please stop by the Town Office prior to engagement from the Bylaw Enforcement Officer.

Spayed or neutered dogs: \$30.00

Unaltered dogs: \$60.00

Public Notice:

The carbon tax came into effect on January 1st, 2017 you will see a line item on your monthly utility bills "CARBON TAX LEVY". The levy is collected and remitted to the Province for each gigajoule of gas consumed per household at a rate of \$1.01 l.

This will be seen on your January utility bill. This is a Provincial Government initiative.
