- You can not drive a vehicle, stop, park, leave a vehicle, attended or unattended, upon a highway parking lot or other public place in in any way that will block, obstruct, impede or hinder traffic.

- o Without permission, you can not park any type of vehicle on private property other than on the highway or road immediately adjoining the property owned, occupied or otherwise controlled by that person.
- o Except as permitted, any vehicle parked for more than seventy-two (72) hours shall be considered abandoned.

Please refrain from parking on any property that does not belong to you without the express permission of the owner.

DAILY - 9:00 am - 6:00 pm - no outside watering.


Wed, Fri and Sun. - Odd numbered homes.
