Next regular council meeting is scheduled for March 16th 2017 at 6:00 p.m. All meetings are open to the public.

Please be advised, Council gave 1st to Bylaw #529 "Reduction of Councillors". Council is preparing to give 2nd and 3rd reading during the March 16th, 2017 meeting at 6:00 p.m. in the chambers at the Town Office, everyone welcome.

A reduction in council means changing from an elected body of seven (7) to an elected body of five (5). The Chief Elected Officer (Mayor) will continue to be elected at large.

CURB SIDE RECYCLING PILOT PROJECT UPDATE

Program begins APRIL 6th, 2017

Sedgewick's pick-up is the first Thursday of each month.

Flagstaff Waste Management and the Town of Sedgewick has partnered in a curb side recycling pilot project.

HOW IT WORKS:

⇒ For curb side recycling place your recyclables in clear blue plastic bags and leave them beside your garbage pick up.

YOU CAN RECYCLE:

- ⇒ Hard plastic #1-7 only. All plastic must be cleaned and rinsed before recycled.
- ⇒ Tin cans. All tins must be cleaned and rinsed before recycled.
- ⇒ Cardboard. Small amounts only and must be folded.
- ⇒ Refundable items (cans, bottles etc.).
- ⇒ Paper.

DO NOT RECYCLE ITEMS:

- ⇒ Styrofoam or clamshells
- ⇒ Plastic bags, film plastic and other light plastics
- ⇒ Oil jugs

OTHER:

- ⇒ Blue bags do not have to be sorted.
- ⇒ You are encouraged to recycle—unlimited blue bags accepted.
- ⇒ Large bins will remain behind the Wooden Spoons on 49th Street for your convenience.
