January 18, 2018 Council Meeting Highlights

Land Use Bylaw Application #17-01

Council gave second and third reading to Bylaw No. 534 – An Amendment to Land Use Bylaw #461. The bylaw rezones Plan 8221051, Block 31, Lot 5 from "I" Industrial District to "C1" Commercial Central District.

Application for Development Permit #2017-13

Council approved Development Permit #2017-13 for SW09-444-12W4 without further conditions. The application was to construct an ancillary building on the property that is zoned as "DC" Direct Control District. All uses within DC Districts are subject to approval by Council upon a review of the merits of the proposal and Council may refer to other sections of the Land Use Bylaw to determine requirements. A permit does not come into effect until 14 days after the date the approval is posted.

2018 Strategic Plan

Council approved the 2018 Strategic Plan. The plan names six priorities which includes underground infrastructure replacement, main street revitalization and Phase I of a new residential subdivision. The plan can be found at http://sedgewick.ca/government/strategic-objectives/

Recreation Centre Naming Rights RFP

Council approved issuing a Request for Proposal to solicit bids for the naming rights of the Rec Centre.

Boulevard Bylaw

Council gave first reading to Bylaw No. 537/18, the Town of Sedgewick Boulevard Bylaw. The bylaw outlines maintenance responsibilities of Town boulevards with an emphasis on the issue of boulevard trees.

Appointment of Fire Chief

Council appointed Tyson Armitage as the new Fire Chief for the Town of Sedgewick.

Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership - 2018 Budget

Council approved the 2018 budget for the Flagstaff Intermunicipal Partnership which includes a requisition to the Town of Sedgewick for \$7,581.76.

Thinking about renovating or building this year?

Are there some building upgrades in your 2018 plans? Finish that basement? Build a new garage? Add on a master suite? Here's a list of the Municipal and Provincial processes and requirements:

- a. For new construction, any structural changes or, for construction valued over \$5,000:
 - 1. Municipal Development Permit—apply at the Town office.

Then upon approval of Development Permit, proceed to:

- 2. <u>Provincial Building Permit</u>—forms are available at Town Office or online at: <u>superiorsafetycodes.com</u> or call Superior Safety Codes Inc. at: 1-888-358-5085.
- b. For Plumbing, Electrical or Natural Gas improvements:
 - 1. <u>Provincial Permit</u> required, per specified discipline, from Superior Safety Codes Inc.



Differences between a Development Permit Versus a Building Permit?

<u>Development Permit</u> is issued by the Municipality and deals with such items as zoning, per the Land Use Bylaw and any restrictions on what type of construction may be proposed. This permit must be secured prior to the Building Permit application.

<u>Building Permit</u> is issued by the Town's contracted service provider 'Superior Safety Codes Inc.' The Building Permit allows construction to proceed on condition of compliance with the Alberta Building Code. It deals with structural integrity and public safety. Specific inspection cycles are set out for each Permit, to verify and document that the construction meets compliance conditions.

<u>Permits</u> for other disciplines, i.e. plumbing, electrical, and natural gas, allows the work to proceed on the condition of compliance with each disciplines' Code and Regulations.

Application for the applicable permits provides the property owner with assurance and documentation that the completed construction/improvement has been inspected and is in compliance with the municipality's Land Use Bylaw, the Alberta Building Code, specified disciplines' Codes and the Fire Code. Additionally, the inspection documents can be used for insurance and realtor purposes.




