April 19, 2018 Council Meeting Highlights

2018 Operational Budget

Council approved the 2018 Operational Budget with the Total Taxes Required, increased from 2017 levy of \$798,434 to \$811,977 (+1.68%) The budget was impacted by the Alberta School Foundation Fund (ASFF): Residential properties increased by 4.4%; Non-Residential properties increased by 5.9%; and the Seniors' Housing Foundation Requisition increased by 2.5%. The Operational Budget is available on the Town of Sedgewick website.

2018 Capital Budget

Council directed administration to make amendments to the 2018 Capital budget and bring back to the May 2018 regular meeting of Council for approval.

Council endorsed Tax Bylaw 539 that authorizes the Mill Rates used to calculate the Tax Levy on all property within the Town of Sedgewick. Overall tax levies (inclusive of ASFF and the Seniors Foundation Fund,) for Residential will increase by 5.6% and Non-Residential by 5.1%.

Inter-municipal Development Plan Bylaw 540


Council gave first reading to IDP Bylaw 540 which is a Bylaw to ensure that a coordinated and cooperative approach is in place for managing the use and development of lands adjacent to the boundary of the Town of Sedgewick within Flagstaff

Dufferin Avenue Designation

Council endorsed a motion to remove the designation of Dufferin Avenue from Plan 4763AJ as the roadway designation caused conflicting address allocations and the possibility of future development expansion onto the golf course to create a block of lots that would access the Avenue was extremely unlikely.

Tax Payment & Penalty Bylaw 541

Council endorsed the Tax Payment & Penalty Bylaw 541 that rescinded the previous Tax Payment, Non-Payment, Pre-Payment & Penalties Bylaw 459.

Black Knot Disease in Sedgewick

Black Knot, caused by the fungus Apiosporima bosa is a very common disease of the genus Prunus (all Cherry Genus, Mayday, Plum & Apricot). This dis-

ease reduces the aesthetic value of affected specimens as infections spread rapidly. The most distinguishing symptom of Black Knot is the characteristic black, tar-like swellings that develop on branches of the infected plant.

What can be done to control Black Knot?

- Remove all sources of inoculum (prevents population build up)
- Prune out all knot-bearing branches during late fall, winter or very early spring when plants are dormant & knots are easy to
- Remove infected branches to at least 15-20 cm below knot.
- As a precaution, cutting blades should be cleaned and disinfected after pruning
- Failure to remove branches beyond the internal growth will result in re-growth of the fungus.
- DISEASED WOOD MUST BE DESTROYED IMMEDIATELY (burned, buried or removed from the site.) Diseased knots can produce and release spores for up to 4 months after removal.

Please help stop the spread of this disease in our community!
