



### July 12, 2018 Council Meeting Highlights

#### **Residential Subdivision Utility Installation**

Council assigned \$150,000 in the 2019 capital budget for the installation of underground power and gas services in front of the Phase I Residential Subdivision lots. This amount was based on a conservative estimate provided by Associated Engineering.

#### Sanitary Sewer Analysis

Council reviewed and accepted as information, a Sanitary Sewer Analysis report that outlined the future capacity of the current sewer framework.

#### Sanitary Sewer CCTV Inspection

Council reviewed and accepted a report regarding the Sanitary Sewer CCTV inspection that was undertaken this spring. The report identified priority lines requiring repair.

#### National Drowning Prevention Week Proclamation

Council proclaimed July 15-21, 2018 NATIONAL DROWNING PREVENTION WEEK and commended its thoughtful recognition to all citizens of the Town of Sedgewick.

#### Flagstaff Regional Subdivision & Development Board & Intermunicipal Assessment Appeal Board

Council endorsed the appointment of Diane Gordon (Killam) to the Flagstaff Regional Development & Subdivision Appeal Board and the Intermunicipal Assessment Appeal Board for three-year terms expiring in June 2021.

#### **COW Bus Funding**

Council approved a \$500 donation to the Flagstaff Beaver Early Childhood Coalition to fund the COW (Classroom on Wheels) bus attendance in Hardisty, Sedgewick and Daysland on October 3rd and 4th.

### Sedgewick Lake Park – Spray Park Capital Grant

Council amended Motion#2018-07-142 to state the amount allocated from the Recreation Capital Reserves GL#49700998 for the Sedgewick Lake Spray Park will be \$35,000.



#### Please help keep our community clean!

Solid Waste Bylaw 533 regulates that <u>ALL GARBAGE MUST BE PLACED IN RECEPTACLES</u> for pick-up.

"No person shall allow waste to spill over or accumulate on any alley, highway or adjoining public or private property. Every person will ensure that all waste is kept within their receptacle at all times".

Placing your Garbage for pick-up in a bag, in an enclosed container will prevent any problems with birds or animals, excessive wind or rain and, will keep your neighbourhood looking clean and well maintained.

Boulevard Bylaw 537—Application Town Council deemed it important to maximize public safety and to maintain the aesthetic appeal of the Town boulevards.

Boulevard Bylaw 537 regulates that no person other than the Town staff shall:

- Pave any or all of a boulevard or back alley unless and until a permit to do so has been authorized
- Be responsible for the repair of boulevard sidewalks and fire hydrants
- Plant a tree on a boulevard or a back alley
- Prune, repair, trim or perform any work on a boulevard tree
