### Aug.23, 2018 Council Meeting Highlights

#### Outdoor Watering Bylaw 542/18

Council approved Outdoor Watering Bylaw 542/18, which repealed Water Restriction Bylaw 473. Key points in Bylaw 542/18:

- ◆ Regular watering restrictions restrict watering by sprinkler, hose or pipe from 10 am to 5 pm between June 1<sup>st</sup> and October 1<sup>st</sup>; *there is no differentiation between even- and odd-numbered houses.*
- ◆ Special outdoor water restrictions come into effect at the discretion of the Public Works Foreman. This is a further restriction on water as compared to the regular restrictions.

#### Bylaw 544/18 - Amendment #6 to Land Use Bylaw 461

Council provided first reading to Bylaw 544/18 - Amendment #6 to Land Use Bylaw 461 which addresses a procedural discretion between LUB 461 and the existing practise of setting fees for Development Permits. #### Policies:

Council approved the following policies: (All policies viewable on the Town's website: [www.sedgewick.ca](http://www.sedgewick.ca))

- ◆ **Compensation & Expenses Policy 18-07** –The policy establishes honorarium and per diem amounts and other compensation such as mileage, meals and gratuities. It also concisely lays out responsibilities, eligible expenses and who may approve expense claims.
- ◆ **Portable Stage Rental Policy 18-08**– a policy to make the Town's portable stage available to Non-Profit & Community Groups for use within the Town of Sedgewick and also to approved entities outside the Town of Sedgewick.
- ◆ **Municipal Lot Lease Policy 18-09** – a policy has been approved to accompany the Lot Lease Agreement. Key points:
  - ⇒ Lots are leased on a first-come, first served basis
  - ⇒ Term remains at 1 full year for \$600 (no option for a shorter term)
  - ⇒ Policy refers to relevant Bylaws that must be followed
