September 20, 2018 Council Meeting Highlights

Bylaw 544 - Amendment #6 to LUB#461

A Public Hearing was held at 6 pm; there were no written or verbal responses received regarding Bylaw 544. Council endorsed second and third readings to the Bylaw which addressed "Section 14. Fees." Read the entire Bylaw at www.sedgewick.ca

Main Street Revitalization Design

Council directed Administration to have Main Street renderings produced that would omit a center promenade and include wider sidewalks, bulbs at pedestrian crossings and ornamentation on the sidewalks.

2019 FortisAB Franchise Agreement Fee

Council filed the information on a revision to the FortisAB Electric Franchise Fee rate for information; there will be *no change* to the 2019 Electric Franchise Fees in Sedgewick.

Recreation Funding Committee Bylaw 545

Council gave first reading to Bylaw 545, the Recreation Funding Committee Bylaw which would direct the Town to enter into a Recreation Funding Agreement with the Sedgewick & District Agricultural Society to administer the Flagstaff County annual recreation grant; read Draft Bylaw 545 at: sedgewick.ca

Parade Float Design

Council approved a parade float design but postponed its production to the 2020 budget preparations.

The Town of Sedgewick has announced that the Canadian Country Music Association's reigning "Male Artist of the Year", **Brett Kissel**, will be playing the **Wild Rose Co-op Recreation Centre** in Sedgewick, Alberta on <u>Saturday, November 10th</u> as part of his "We Were That Song" Tour. Kissel is one of the nation's leading country music creatives and is well known for the steamroll intensity he brings to each show. He has also received an armful of other CCMA awards including the 2017 Video of the Year with "I Didn't Fall in Love With Your Hair", the 2016 "Fan's Choice Award" and "Interactive Artist of the Year" from 2014 to 2017.



Special guest **Julian Austin** will be playing as the opening act and fans will be treated to his own #1 hit with "Little Ol' Kisses" which won him CCMA's "Best Country Single" in 1998. Austin is a big supporter of the military and has made a number of trips overseas to support our troops making him an ideal fit for the Remembrance Day weekend



RECYCLE PROGRAM CHANGES!!

The Board and Management of Flagstaff Waste Management, which is owned by every municipality in Flagstaff as well as Rosalind, have taken a hard look at the current household recycling materials market, and are making some changes:

Under the new program, yellow commingled bins and mixed paper bins have been removed from all current collection centres. In their place, 12 collection centres will receive "Newsprint only" bins, "Bond paper only" bins, "Tin Cans Only" bins, and newly labelled "#1 and #2 Plastics only" bins. Each recycling centre will retain their compost collection bins, and their cardboard recycling bins.

Flagstaff Waste will monitor use and will modify frequency of collection to ensure that each centre is nearing capacity when it's time to collect. That ensures that the program runs as efficiently as possible for trucks and drivers, too.

As the market has shifted since China essentially closed its doors to all but the <u>cleanest plastic</u>, options for marketing mixed loads of recycling are not feasible.

Winter Snowbirds—Property Maintenance

It is very important that Snow Birds arrange to have their property cared for during their winter absence.

- 1. Hire someone to shovel snow regularly
- Hire someone to perform a walk-through and flush toilets to ensure the sanitary sewer line does not freeze, at least weekly.
- Avoid a vacant look-set up timers to turn on a few lights; ask neighbour(s) to park and/or drive in and out of your driveway.
- Be ready for emergencies! If using an alarm company-notify them you will be away; provide emergency contact numbers to your House Sitter.
- Perform routine maintenance before you leave.

Black Knot Disease in Sedgewick

Black Knot, caused by the fungus *Apiosporima morbosa* is a very common disease of the genus *Prunus* (all Cherry Genus, Mayday, Plum & Apricot). This disease reduces the aesthetic value of affected specimens as infections spread rapidly. The most distinguishing symptom of Black Knot is the characteristic black, tar-like swellings that develop on branches of the infected plant.

What can be done to control Black Knot?

- Remove all sources of inoculum (prevents population build up)
- Prune out all knot-bearing branches <u>during late fall, winter or very early</u> spring when plants are dormant & knots are easy to see
- Remove infected branches to at least 15-20 cm below knot.
- As a precaution, cutting blades should be cleaned and disinfected after pruning
- Failure to remove branches beyond the internal growth will result in regrowth of the fungus
- DISEASED WOOD MUST BE DESTROYED IMMEDIATELY (burned.) buried or removed from the site.) Diseased knots can produce and release spores for up to 4 months after removal.
