October 18, 2018 Council Organizational Meeting Highlights

Deputy Mayor:

Council endorsed the appointment of Councillor Stephen Levy as Deputy Mayor effective immediately, to October 2019.

Council Meeting Dates:

Council approved the continuance of Regular Council Meetings being held on the third Thursday of the month at 6:00 PM.

Board & Committee Appointments:

Council maintained the current Board and Committee appointments.

Council Remuneration:

Council maintained the current rates for Councillor Remuneration.

October 18, 2018 Council Regular Meeting Highlights

Flagstaff SDAB & IARB Appointment:

Council approved the appointment of Sylvia Wold to the Flagstaff Regional Subdivision & Development Appeal Board and to the Intermunicipal Assessment Review Board, each for a three-year term expiring in October 2021.

Parkland Regional Library 2019 Budget:

Council approved the 2019 Parkland Regional Library Requisition at \$8.25 per capita, a \$0.13 per capita increase over the 2018 budget; however the total requisition remains \$200 less than the 2017 requisition.

Recreation Funding Committee – Phase II Funding Recommendations:
Council approved the Recreation Funding Committee's 2018 Phase II grant recommendations:

\$5,000 to Sedgewick Minor Ball

\$5,000 to Sedgewick Golf Club

\$1,417.90 to Sedgewick Community Hall Association

2018 Capital Budget – MSI Allocation:

Council approved an application under the Municipal Sustainability Initiative Capital Grant Program for the Water Treatment Plant SCADA and HVAC Projects for grant applications totalling \$210,000.

Main Street Concept

Council approved a revised Main Street Concept in principle.

Council passed Subdivision Authority Bylaw 546; see full text of the Bylaw on www.Sedgewick.ca Council appointed CAO J. Fedyk as the Subdivision Authority for the Town of Sedgewick with delegating authority.

Development Permit 2018-10

Council approved Development Permit 2018-10 for Plan 3825P, Block 15, Lots 29 & 30 for a fence variance of a 6-foot high fence and a setback of six feet from the north end of the lot.

Development Permit 2018-11

Council approved Development Permit 2018-11 for Plan 4227MC, Block 21, Lots 4 & 5 for a front-yard setback variance of 7.71 metres.

NEW RECYCLING PROGRAM

The new FRSWMA Recycling Program Bins have arrived at the Sedgewick Recycling Depot.

Each bin is clearly marked and labelled with detailed information on what are acceptable recycling items and what are not:

- **Newsprint Only**
- **Bond Paper Only**
- Tin Cans Only
- #1 and #2 Plastics Only
- Cardboard & Boxboard Only

Please review the new recycling program requirements. It is very important that the bins are used appropriately in order to maximize the return on the investment, to help extend the life of the existing landfill space and to help maintain/reduce the Association's budget.

The markets have shifted; options for marketing mixed loads of recycling are not feasible. The New Recycling Program is addressing the changing Markets.

Black Knot Disease in Sedgewick

Black Knot, caused by the fungus *Apiosporima morbosa* is a very common disease of the genus *Prunus* (all Cherry Genus, Mayday, Plum & Apricot). This disease reduces the aesthetic value of affected specimens as infections spread rapidly. The most distinguishing symptom of Black Knot is the characteristic black, tar-like swellings that develop on branches of the infected plant.

What can be done to control Black Knot?

- Remove all sources of inoculum (prevents population (au bliud
- Prune out all knot-bearing branches <u>during late fall</u>, <u>winter or very early</u> spring when plants are dormant & knots are easy to see
- Remove infected branches to at least 15-20 cm below knot.
- As a precaution, cutting blades should be cleaned and disinfected after pruning
- Failure to remove branches beyond the internal growth will result in regrowth of the fungus
- DISEASED WOOD MUST BE DESTROYED IMMEDIATELY (burned.) buried or removed from the site.) Diseased knots can produce and release spores for up to 4 months after removal.
