FLAGSTAFF REGIONAL EMERGENCY SERVICES SOCIETY – 2021 REQUISITION

Council approved the payment of \$33,459.16 to the Flagstaff Regional Emergency Services Society for the 2021 requisition.

TOWN OF SEDGEWICK LIBRARY BOARD - RE-APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS

Council re-appointed 3 members-at-large to the Town of Sedgewick Library Board as well as Councillor Levy as the Town of Sedgewick representative.

ROLLS 30005329 & 30005331 - REQUEST TO FORGIVE TAX PENALTY

Council declined the request to waive the tax penalty on rolls 30005329 and 30005331.

BYLAW 556 - ANIMAL CONTROL BYLAW

Council directed administration to confirm with a resident by letter that households are only allowed 2 dogs.

SEGEWICK PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD - REQUEST FOR FUNDING

In response to a presentation made by a delegation earlier in the meeting, Council decided to defer a request from the Library Board for the Town of Sedgewick to purchase a building on Main Street that the library could move to until their next meeting. Council directed administration to explain to the board that due to budgetary constraints and their term of office soon coming to an end, it was unlikely that they would move forward with the proposal at this time.

OUTDOOR WATERING – REVISION OF BYLAWS

Council directed administration to present a version of the Fees and Charges Bylaw at the next regular meeting providing for an escalation of water fees once households and businesses exceed 30 cubic meters in one month of utility billing and to also bring back a revised version of the Outdoor Watering Bylaw limiting outdoor watering permanently to Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays from 7pm to 11pm.

FLAGSTAFF SCOTTISH CLUB – HIGHLAND GAMES

Council waived the portable stage rental fee for the Flagstaff Scottish Club at their Highland Games event on August 21st, 2021.

Black Knot Disease

Black knot is a fungal disease that causes greenish brown to black swellings in the stems of cherry trees. Its spores are released following periods of warm, wet weather and are spread by splashing water,

wind, birds, and insects. Black knot deforms branches and reduces their growth. Heavily infected trees often become stunted and may eventually die from the disease.

**How to Deal with Black Knot**

- Prune the infected branches between late fall and early spring when the plants are dormant
- Remove the infected branches to at least 6-8 inches below the knot, preferably to the collar
- Sterilize your cutting tools between each cut using bleach to prevent further spread of the disease
- Destroy infected prunings immediately
